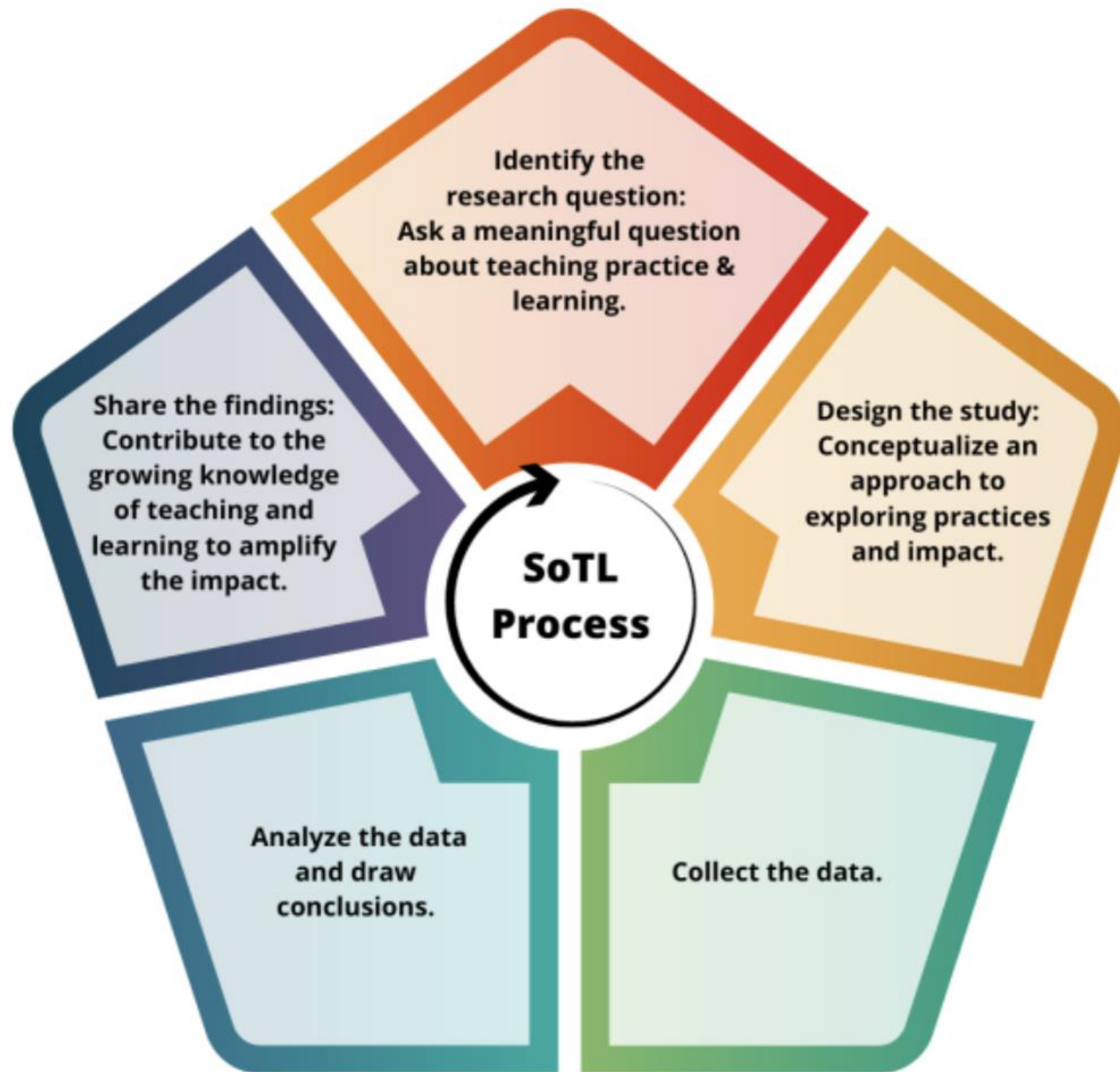
Open to individuals or groups contributing to Columbia College's learning experiences, including facilitators and staff

CLS to match up to \$5,000 of funds raised through research scholarship fundraising activities

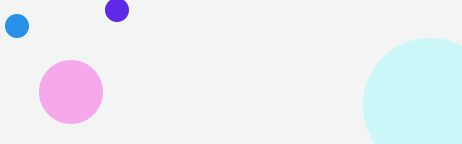
Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) Process



Stream 1: Scholarship of Teaching & Learning

Blend of research and teaching, focusing on understanding and improving student learning and the teaching approaches that impact it

Engage in methodical research and share their findings to influence both their teaching and practices beyond their classrooms



Stream 1: Criteria for Evaluation



Impact: Does the project have the potential to advance teaching and learning at Columbia College?

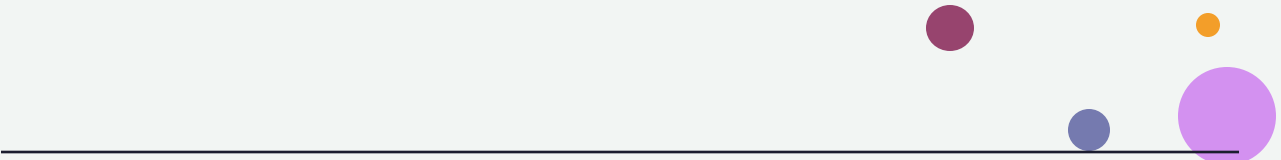


Novelty: Is the project exploring a novel practice or context within the SoTL literature?



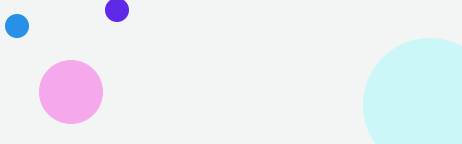
Practicality: Can the goals be achieved within the designated time frame and budget?

Stream 2: Development & Innovation



Develop new teaching resources or innovate existing ones

Creating new materials, implementing innovative practices, and redesigning activities or programs



Stream 2: Criteria for Evaluation



Creativity and Impact: Does the project introduce novel ideas that have the potential to transform teaching and learning practices at Columbia College?



Feasibility: Is the project plan realistic and achievable within the given timeframe and resources?



Sustainability: Can the innovation be sustained and scaled beyond the initial project phase?



Collaboration: Does the project involve collaboration with other stakeholders, such as facilitators from different disciplines, community partners, students or industry experts?
